Yet, without official recognition, Namibian Sign Language remains marginalized, and so do the people who depend on it.

WHY IT MATTERS:

- Language is a Human Right: Denying recognition to Namibian Sign Language is denying access to communication, culture, and identity.
- Inclusive Education: Learners who use Sign Language deserve qualified teachers, accessible materials, and equal opportunities to learn.
- Economic Participation: Without recognition, barriers persist in workplaces, public services, and civic life.



CALL TO ACTION: WHAT THE GOVERNMENT MUST DO

 Legally Recognize Sign Language as an Official Language

Enshrine Sign Language in national law to affirm its status, protect its use, and promote its development across all sectors.

2 Fund Interpreter Services and Training Programs:

Invest in professional Sign Language interpreters and training to ensure accessibility in schools, hospitals, courts, and public events.

Integrate Sign Language into Public Education and Media

> Mandate Sign Language instruction in schools and include it in public broadcasting to normalize its use and foster inclusion.

Sign Language is a vital, vibrant language that deserves full recognition. Legal status, funding, and integration into public life are essential steps toward equality. The government must act now to ensure no one is left unheard.

WHAT YOU AS AN INDIVIDUAL CAN DO

- Raise Awareness

- Engage Politically: Write to local representatives and participate in public hearings or campaigns advocating for legal recognition, if need be, sign petitions!
- Learn and Promote Sign Language:
 Take courses, encourage friends to
 take up Sign Language classes, and
 use it in daily life to normalize its
 presence (NNAD offers classes).
- Support Deaf-Led Initiatives:
 Donate to or volunteer with
 organizations led by Deaf individuals
 such as NNAD and NDEO. Their voices
 must be central in this movement.

WHAT CORPORATES CAN DO

- Implement Inclusive Policies Recognize Namibian Sign Language as a workplace language. Hire interpreters, offer training, and ensure Deaf employees have equal access to communication.
- Fund Advocacy and Education
 Sponsor awareness campaigns,
 interpreter training programs, and
 inclusive education initiatives.

Every time Sign Language is used in public spaces—whether by a teacher, a CEO, or a content creator—it reinforces its legitimacy.

The more visible and normalized it becomes, the harder it is for governments to ignore the call for official recognition.
